

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

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What is a STEM EcosySTEM?




- STEM Learning Ecosystems provides architecture for cross-sector learning offering all young people access to STEM-rich learning environments so they can develop important skills and engagement in STEM throughout preK-16
- A large international community of practice that includes
 - 89 ecosystems
 - 5 countries
 - 33 million students
 - 1,200 out-of-school partners
 - 4,350 philanthropic, business and industry organizations





prepare and support PreK-20
educators in STEM education.
Building a database of available
professional development
opportunities for formal and
informal educators in Idaho and
working on developing materials to
showcase the value of
implementing STEM education in
all disciplines.



Career Pathways & Exposure — Focusing on further developing clear STEM career pathways for Idaho's youth. Building a database of resources to broaden awareness and assist in career pathways and exposure. The intent is to share the database with the larger asset mapping project.



Outreach & Communications – Focused on external communication mechanisms. Provides guidance and insight on newsletter and website as primary mechanism for communication to partners. Provided feedback bright spots to highlight members. Reviewed and provided guidance on survey data.



Access and Equity –
Recently completed an
educator survey to develop
"persona mapping" of
underserved student
populations. Launching
survey shortly and will share
out results. Our goal is to
identify barriers to access and
develop strategies to
overcome.
